## CONDITIONS

### Tertiary and Refugee Study Scholarships

1. Catholic Foundation Scholarships are available to Catholic students residing in the Wellington Archdiocese who are in their final year of secondary education.
2. Each Catholic College is entitled to nominate a maximum of two students for a Catholic Foundation scholarship.
3. In circumstances where students attend a State or Private secondary school or The Correspondence School or are home-schooled a Parish Priest may nominate a maximum of two students from his own parish for a Catholic Foundation Scholarship.
4. Each successful scholarship recipient will receive a scholarship of \$3000 per year for up to three years towards the cost of full time study for a Degree/Diploma/Certificate course at a New Zealand University or Polytechnic Institute. Each scholarship will be paid as follows:
  - \$3,000 to be paid to the recipient upon the presentation of course confirmation for the first year of study to the Foundation's Secretary
  - A further \$3,000 to be paid to the recipient for each of the following two years upon presentation to the Foundation's Secretary of satisfactory progress in the preceding year, and course confirmation for the following year. Progress will be considered "satisfactory" by the Foundation Board if the student achieves an average mark of or in excess of "B" in their courses.  
In the event of the above standard not being achieved, the Foundation Board will to consider the circumstances and act accordingly.
5. In determining the award of the scholarship, the Catholic Foundation Scholarships Selection Committee will consider the all-round qualities of each applicant, not only the academic achievement, but also the potential contribution that the applicant may make to the future of the Catholic Church and New Zealand society. The decision of the Foundation Scholarships Selection Committee is final and no appeal on decisions made will be entered into.
6. The Foundation Scholarships Selection Committee will select a shortlist of applicants who may be called for an interview at the Catholic Centre in Wellington, or who may be interviewed on-line via Skype, at the option of the Scholarships Committee. The selection of applicants will be a matter of the Committee's judgment and will be based on the perceived quality of each scholarship application. All applicants and the College/School Principal and the Parish Priest will be notified in writing as to the outcome of the scholarship application.
7. The Catholic Foundation of the Archdiocese of Wellington reserves the right to publicise the name and photograph of each scholarship recipient in the Archdiocesan monthly newspaper (Wel-Com), the Foundation's website, and in other Catholic publications as deemed appropriate.
8. The Catholic Foundation places no restriction on Foundation Scholarship recipients as to the number of other scholarships that the recipient may hold simultaneously. However, the Catholic Foundation cannot and does not purport to speak for other scholarship providers in this matter and the conditions that may be attached to other scholarships. The onus therefore rests with each Catholic Foundation Scholarship applicant to be familiar with the application requirements of other scholarship providers when such applications are being planned.
9. Foundation Scholarship applications must be received by the Catholic Foundation P O Box 1937, Wellington by Friday 1 September 2017. Late applications will NOT be accepted.
